## Birkdale gap Drove Road Cow Green

### 1 OS 1:25,000

The route is shown with the red lines A - B - C. A to B ran along the east side of the syke. Between B and C, the dotted lines indicate that the way needs to join B to C, a route in principal. Old maps show routes converging on the farmstead – the traveller would have simply negotiated the farm yard. There has been a significant increase in the building footprint which the route will need to circumvent to reach the existing bridleway at point C. Point A is clearly an anomalous end to the bridle road. The ford itself would not be a point of destination, the link with the Bridleway at Birkdale appears simply to have been missed off in Cumbria.
