



# Annual Statement on Developer Contributions obtained through the Planning System

**December 2021** 

# **Cumbria County Council**



#### 1. Introduction

This Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) is an annual report which provides a summary of all developer contributions agreed, received, held and spent by Cumbria County Council in the 2020/2021 financial year. Publishing this data is a requirement of the Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2019. Infrastructure Funding Statements are intended to improve transparency in respect of developer contributions and help promote improved co-ordination and delivery of infrastructure.

#### 2. Two-tier Local Government and LGR

In Cumbria at present, there exists a County Council on the upper tier, covering the whole administrative area. At the lower tier, there are a number of district councils, covering smaller administrative areas. Cumbria also has two national parks (Lake District and Yorkshire Dales) which are local planning authorities, but which also fall within one (or more) districts. For the purposes of this IFS, the reporting is focused on districts although this position will be reviewed for future versions of the document when Cumbria will be replaced by the two new unitary authorities of Cumberland and Westmorland & Furness.

The statutory responsibilities for public services in two tier areas are assigned to one or other of these levels –for instance, county councils are responsible for matters such as:

- Highways
- Transport
- Education
- Waste management (e.g., household waste recycling centres and landfill sites)
- Libraries
- Social care
- Minerals and waste (outside of national parks) plus 'Regulation 3' planning applications (i.e., schools, libraries & care homes owned/controlled by the County Council)

Whereas the following are typically dealt with at the lower tier level by the relevant district:

- all other planning applications (unless within national parks which are the 'local planning authority' for determining applications)
- Housing (e.g., ensuring provision of affordable housing and devising housing strategies)
- Waste collection (kerbside)
- Environmental health
- Leisure and recreation.

The County Council works collaboratively with the district/borough Councils and National Park local planning authorities to shape their Local Development Plans and produce Infrastructure Delivery Plans, against which requests for developer contributions are also informed.

#### 3. Community Infrastructure Levy

Developer Contributions can also be secured through the planning system using the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) which is a locally set tariff rate based on the floorspace created by certain types of development. Within Cumbria, CIL is currently only established and collected in South Lakeland District Council's planning area (which excludes areas that fall within the national parks).

Within the 2020-2021 financial year the County Council has not received any CIL funding from South Lakeland District Council. When CIL funding is received by the County Council this will be reported in future Infrastructure Funding Statements.

#### 4. S.106 Developer Contributions

A Section 106 agreements uses a formal legal contract between involved parties and contains obligations that relate directly to the development and are fair and reasonable in scale and kind. Obligations may include on-site requirements such as the construction of affordable housing, or financial contributions towards off-site provisions such as education and health

This statement has been structured to provide a concise overview of the key figures we are required to report.

The following definitions are used to reflect the various stages of developer contributions:

#### Agreed

Contributions that have been agreed within a signed legal document which have not yet been collected. In the majority of cases this is due to the trigger point within the agreement not being met yet.

#### Received

Contributions received, either monetary or non-monetary.

#### **Allocated**

Contributions that have been received and allocated internally to specific projects.

#### **Spent**

Monetary or non-monetary contributions that have been applied to finance expenditure.
