Cumbrian SACRE annual survey: as part of our new <u>development plan</u> for 2024-2029, we are formalising when we carry out an annual RE and Collective Worship Survey. This will be sent out to all primary and secondary schools each spring term. The link will also be included in the March newsletter.
