

## **Thrive with Arts, Culture and Heritage Fund 2024/2025**

The aim of this fund was to help empower arts, cultural and heritage organisations, through funding and support, in the delivery of projects that actively contribute to supporting a diverse cultural and heritage offer within their local community and a better quality of life across Westmorland and Furness.

These grants were aimed at existing not-for-profit arts, cultural and heritage organisations in Westmorland and Furness that played a pivotal role in creating vibrant places and communities, but were not be in a position to bid for larger grants.

The 2024 / 2025 tranche provided grants to not-for-profit arts, cultural and heritage organisations ranging from £10,000 to £35,000. This funding scheme was offered through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and the Rural England Prosperity Fund.
